- Abstracts must be based on one of the Summit themes listed below and be trauma-informed and culturally responsive.
- Abstracts from collaborative groups are welcome.
- All abstracts are to be formatted for one 30-minute presentation (inclusive of Q&A), delivered in person on 19 March 2026 at Adelaide Oval
