What is ParentsNext?

The Australian Government has provided funding to KWY to work with you to help identify your education and employment goals, develop a pathway to achieve these goals and link you to activities and services in your local community.

KWY will support you to meet your goals and walk with you each step of the way helping you develop strategies and find out what you aim to do after your youngest child has started school.

KWY will work with you to:

- Finding out your goals and aspirations towards training, education, or work to support your family in the future.
- Working together to develop a plan relating to you. This plan will include understanding and building your skills, undertaking training and gaining employment. This plan will also include strategies to address any issues you are currently experiencing. KWY will.
- Assist you to access and participate in training and education, workshops, mentoring opportunities or language and literacy activities in order to support the achievement of your long term goals.
- Assist you with job preparation and interview skills.
- Help connect you to other support services in North Adelaide / South Adelaide or Port Augusta region. If needed we will refer you and your family to more specialised support services for assistance.
- Help you to find and access funding to support your training and education.
- Help you to explore and source childcare opportunities and provide you with information on childcare fee assistance; and
- Support you to keep participating, supporting you to develop strategies which work for you and,
- Provide you with feedback during your time in the Parents Next project activities and give you an opportunity to give us feedback on what works and what doesn't.
